The Office of Head Start defines dual language learners as children who "acquire two or more languages simultaneously, and learn a second language while continuing to develop their first language. The term "dual language learners" encompasses other terms frequently used, such as Limited English Proficient (LEP), bilingual, English language learners (ELL), English learners, and children who speak a Language Other Than English (LOTE)" (OHS 2009).

Who Are Dual Language Learners? - Desired Results

In California, nearly 60% of young children are considered dual language learners (DLLs), defined as children who are learning another language in addition to English from birth to five years of age. In 2019, 98% of licensed center-based programs and 70% of licensed family child care homes (FCCHs) in California served at least one DLL.

Dual language learners may seem scared or overwhelmed, stay silent during class, play by themselves, or have trouble working in pairs or groups.

Teaching Strategies for Working with Dual Language ...

A substantial and growing number of preschool aged children are learning English as a second language. In 2006-2007, approximately 42 percent of California kindergarten children were identified as English learners. Current estimates indicate that approximately 39 percent of all children aged three to five are learning English as second language.

Dual Language Learners - Child Trends

Many classrooms include children who speak languages other than English at home--some who have been learning two or more languages from birth, others who are first exposed to English when they enter preschool. It is important for teachers to adapt their teaching strategies to support dual language learners as they develop their English skills.

Dual language learners—children between the ages of 0-8 who are in the process of learning English while still learning their home language—represent a large and growing share of the early childhood population in the United States.
